For parents, establishing appropriate boundaries fosters positive behaviors, supports social development, and strengthens the parent-child relationship by promoting trust and mutual respect. Clear boundaries also allow children to develop important life skills, such as independence and self-regulation, which are essential for their long-term well-being and success.
