## CLASSROOM NEWS

In Art, Class 3 have made Batik designs on fabric for their Fabric of Nature topic. Using their pencil sketches and traced patterns, (inspired by nature photographs) earlier in the term, they created their batik designs by painting their patterns with glue, then painting over them. Finally, they washed away the glue in the final week, revealing their patterns underneath.



Class 4 Science: Animals including Humans Last half-term, Class 4 were learning about the human digestive system. As part of this unit, we conducted an experiment where we compared the impact different liquids had on our teeth when they were not brushed regularly.
