## Attendance Reminder for Parents

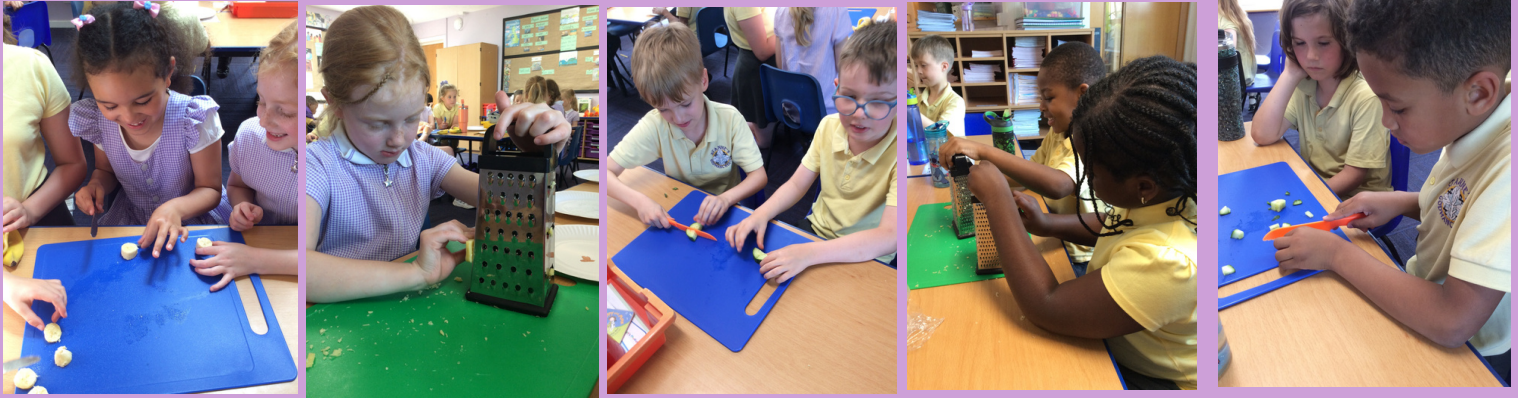

# CLASSROOM NEWS

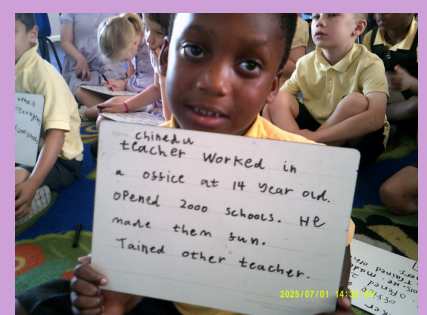
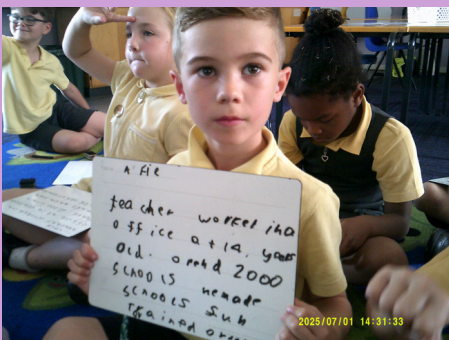
