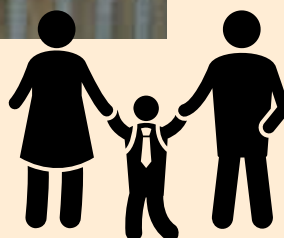
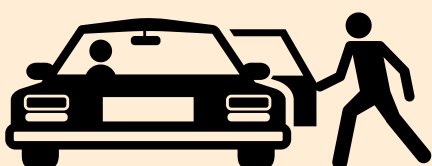

RSE Parent Consultation

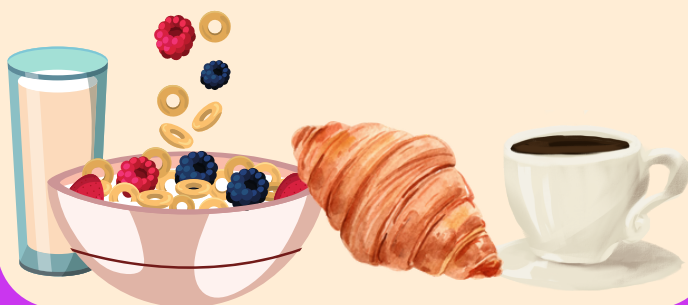
