### **Message from Mrs Curtis**

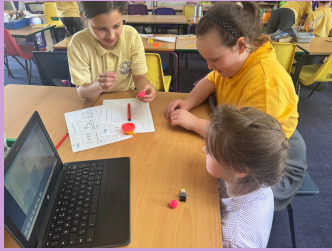
