A Reminder About Online Safety

We would also like to take this opportunity to raise an important reminder around the use of messaging apps, such as WhatsApp, outside of school. We have become aware of a recent increase in incidents involving groups of children communicating via WhatsApp, where disputes have occurred and, in some isolated cases, inappropriate language has been used. Please be aware that WhatsApp has a minimum age requirement of 16 years old. This age restriction is in place to help keep children safe, as messaging platforms are not always monitored and can expose young users to content or conversations that are not age-appropriate. At school, we regularly teach e-safety and support children in understanding how to stay safe online, including the importance of respectful communication and seeking help when something doesn't feel right. We would encourage parents to continue these conversations at home and to monitor their child's online activity closely.

E Safety: Protecting Ourselves Online

Finstas, Fake Accounts, and Social Media Pressure

Many children feel pressure to be on social media before they are old enough. Even if they don't have accounts themselves, they may be aware of trends and influencers through friends or older siblings.

What Are "Finstas" and Fake Accounts? Some children create secret or second accounts ("Finstas") to share different content with a smaller group of friends. These accounts can lead to hidden online interactions and increase risks like cyberbullying or exposure to harmful content.

🛇 Why It's a Concern

Younger children may be tempted to create social media accounts using a fake age.
They may feel pressure to look or act a certain way online.

· Some use hidden accounts to post things they wouldn't want parents or teachers to see.

📱 How Parents Can Help

• Talk openly about social media and why age limits exist.

 \cdot Encourage honesty-children should feel safe discussing online experiences with you.

 \cdot Help them build digital confidence by promoting real-life friendships and activities.
